On November 20, 2014, a Relic of Blessed Josaphata was placed for veneration at St. Nicholas Ukrainian Catholic Church in Winnipeg. People came together to pray, for their

personal and family needs. Through her intercession, faithful also prayed for peace and freedom in Ukraine, and throughout the World.

So who really was Blessed Josaphata?

Sister Josaphata Hordashevska was born Michaelina Hordashevska in the year 1869 in the city of Lviv, where she lived until 1919, when she was called to the Lord. She was a Ukrainian Greek Catholic sister, the first member of the Sisters Servants of Mary Immaculate. At the age of 18, she first chose to consecrate her life to God in a contemplative monastery of St. Basil the Great, the only Eastern-rite congregation for women. However, at that time, Fr. Jeremiah Lomnitsky, a Basilian, decided to establish a women's congregation that focused on the active apostolic life, and Michaelina was asked to be the first member and superior of the order. In June 1892, she was sent to the Roman Catholic community of the Felician Sisters to experience consecrated life in an active apostolic congregation. Two months later Michaelina returned to Lviv and, on 24 August, took the religious habit of the new Congregation and received the name Josaphata, in honor of the Ukrainian Catholic martyr, Saint Josaphat Kuntsevych. Being the first superior of the young sisters, she trained them in the spirit and charism of the Sisters Servants of Mary Immaculate: "serve your people where the need is greatest." In 1914, Mother Josaphata was diagnosed with tuberculosis of the bone. In 1919, at the age of 49 and on the day she had predicted, she died amidst terrible suffering. Her mortal remains were exhumed in 1982 and taken to Rome, where they are kept in a reliquary in the Generalate Motherhouse of the Sisters Servants of Mary Immaculate in Rome. The process of her beatification began in Rome in 1983 and on June 27, 2001 she was beatified by Pope John Paul II in Lviv. Numerous miracles are ascribed due to her intercession after her death.

"Blessed Josaphata, Pray for Us!"

The three key words of the family: please, thank you, sorry

Vatican City, 13 May 2015 (VIS) - "Please, thank you and sorry" are the three words that Pope Francis "would write on the door of every family home" as they are the key to living well and in peace both inside and outside the home. They are simple words, much easier to say than to put into practice, but "they contain great strength: the strength of protecting the home, even through a thousand difficulties and trials; instead, when they are lacking, cracks gradually open up that can even lead it to collapse".

The Pope dedicated the catechesis of today's general audience to these three words, normally considered as the words of politeness. "A great bishop, St. Francis of Sales, said that kindness is halfway to holiness. However, beware", he warned, "as in history we have also known a formalism of good manners that can become a mask to conceal an arid heart and lack of interest in others. ... Not even religion is immune to this risk, in which formal observance may slip into spiritual worldliness. The devil who tempts Jesus shows off his good manners and cites the Sacred Scriptures. His style appears correct, but his intention is to deviate from the truth of God's love".

The first word is "please". "To enter into the life of another person, even when that person forms part of our life, requires the delicacy of a non-intrusive attitude, that renews trust and respect. Confidence, then, does not authorise us to take everything for granted. Love, the more intimate and profound it is, the more it demands respect for freedom and the capacity to wait for the other to open the door of his or her heart".

The second phrase is "thank you". "At times", observed the Holy Father, "it seems that we are becoming a civilisation of poor manners and unpleasant words. ... Politeness and the capacity to thank are seen as a sign of weakness, and at times even arouse distrust. This tendency should be opposed within the family itself. We must become intransigent in the education of gratitude and recognition: the dignity of the person and social justice both come from this. If this approach is neglected in family life, it will also be lost in social life".

The third word is "sorry", as "when it is lacking, small cracks become larger ... to the point of becoming deep trenches. It is not by chance that in the prayer taught by Jesus, the Lord's prayer that summarises all the essential questions for our life, we find the expression 'forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us'".

Acknowledging our errors and being willing to restore what has been removed - respect, sincerity, love - makes one worthy of forgiveness. ... If we are not capable of apologising, it means we are not capable of forgiveness either. ... Many hurt feelings, many lesions in the family begin with the loss of those precious words: 'I am sorry'. In married life there are many arguments ... but I advise you never to let the day end without making peace. And for this, a small gesture is enough".

"These three key words for the family are simple words, and perhaps at first they make us smile. But ... perhaps our education neglects them too much. May the Lord help us to restore them to their rightful place in our heart, in our home, and also in our civil co-existence".

Arius was a protopresbyter of the Church of Alexandria, and in 315, he began to blaspheme against the Son of God

saying that He was not the true God, consubstantial with the Father, but rather a work or creation of God and different from the essence and glory of the Father. He also taught that the Son of God had a beginning. These teachings shook the faithful at Alexandria. The Bishop of Alexandria, Alexander, attempted to correct Arius through admonitions, cut him off from communion, and finally deposed him in 321 through a local council. Arius continued with his heretical teachings, creating controversy and division in the churches of other cities, which led to a theological and ecclesiastical crisis throughout the Christian Church.

Moved with divine zeal and concern for unity, the Emperor Constantine the Great, equal to the Apostles, summoned the First Ecumenical Council in Nicaea, a city of Bithynia. It was in this place that the bishops of the Church gathered in 325. All of them, with one mouth and one voice, declared that the Son and Word of God is one in essence with the Father, true God of true God. The Fathers composed the holy symbol of Faith, the **Nicene Creed**:

"We believe in one God. The Father Almighty. Maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible. And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, the only begotten, begotten of the Father before all ages. Light of Light; true God of true God; begotten, not made; of one essence with the Father, by whom all things were made; who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven, and was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and became man. And He was crucified for us under Pontius Pilate, and suffered, and was buried. And the third day He rose again according to the Scriptures; and ascended into heaven, and sits at the right hand of the Father; and he shall come again with glory to judge the living and the dead; whose Kingdom shall have no end."

The Fathers also anathematized Arius for his heretical beliefs and teachings, cutting him off from the Church.

Recognizing the divine Fathers of the Faith after the divine Apostles, the Church of Christ has appointed this present Sunday for their annual commemoration, in thanksgiving and unto the glory of God, unto their praise and honor, and unto the strengthening of the true Faith.
