"You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt loses its savour, how can it be made salty again?" (Matthew 5:13)

These words, at first glance, seem like a stark warning, especially when we read the rest of the verse that says that such salt is useless and should be thrown out. But yet we want to hope that the Lord Who came into the world to save the lost and hopeless sinners like ourselves, would also provide an answer to his question.... "how can it regain its

saltiness?". In this bulletin, you will find a very abbreviated article about a convert to the Catholic Church who doubts the Catholic Church because Catholics often are not excited about their faith! Then she has an extraordinary experience that moves her and contributes to the changing of her mind. Sr. Rosalind speaks of a very powerful experience that she had one day when visiting a Catholic church. The Priest, in his homily said about our Faith that, 'We need to tell the whole world!" She goes on to describe the moment... "My heart stood still. It was the first time I had sensed a passion for souls from the pulpit of a Catholic Church. I burst into tears. Since the day I met Christ, I've lived to tell others of Him. I thought: If the Catholic Church is true, why aren't Catholics evangelical? Evangelical is not a synonym for Protestant. To be an evangel is to be a messenger; it's to reach out to a lost and hurting world to tell them the good news of Christ — that there is a Savior who came for sinners and who gives life to all who will come to Him." It is an in inspiring account, but it makes us wonder... is this the impression that we give people? That we are not excited or energized about our Faith!? Perhaps it is partially true. I know how many of us must feel. We personally may feel that we are so late in the Evangelization game. And maybe we know far less about our Faith than we ourselves imagine. And even what little we do know - we would be challenged to present it in coherent, meaningful sentences by which we could convince or enthuse our family members, never mind ourselves. Maybe it's best to avoid the rejection and the possible ridicule for our feeble explanations and just quietly attend our comforting Church service by ourselves. It's easier that way. Less work and less struggle and less failure. But no! It is never too late and the time to try is today. We try to share our love for Christ and our Catholic Faith. We keep on going, learning more and preparing better for next time. That is our life!

In conversations with her brother, David, he told her that he had come across an article that said there are Jews who tell others of Him. I thought: If the Catholic Church is true, believe that Jesus Christ is the Jewish Messiah!

Meeting Jewish Believers in Christ

Within three months of that conversation, I had moved to California and met some of these Jews who believed in Christ. They didn't just believe that Jesus Christ was the Jewish Messiah, but that He was God come to earth! How could a man be God? How could you look on God and live?

One life-changing night, I was together with a group of Christians. They told me that God required the shedding of blood for the forgiveness of sin, and they explained how, under the Old Testament sacrificial system, individuals bulls, goats, lambs. Those sacrifices pointed to the One who would one day come and take upon Himself, not the sin of I'm still a bit awkward. I feel as if I've embarked on an one person for a time, but the sins of the entire world, for all time. I couldn't believe what I had just begun to understand. I had become a Christian. I had a relationship with the God of the universe and a reason to live for the first time in my life. I wanted to take a megaphone to the moon and shout of creation has taken on new meaning for me. to the world that God is and that everyone could know Him.

Views of the Catholic Church

My first Bible study as a new Christian was taught by an ex-Catholic, who himself was taught by an ex-priest. So I was taught from the start that the Catholic Church was a cult, a false religious system leading millions astray. It was about a year later that my brother David called to tell me that he too had come to believe that Christ was God, but his many unanswered questions led him to the study of the Catholic Church. When I visited David again. He took me first to meet the monk with whom he was studying and then we went to a midnight Christmas Eve Mass. Eventually David entered the Catholic Church.
