## SESSION VI OF THE PATRIARCHAL SOBOR BEGINS THIS WEEK!

An estimated 300 delegates from every Ukrainian Catholic jurisdiction around the world (every eparchy, exarchate and countries under the guidance of a Vistator) will gather in the historic Ukrainian city of Ivano-Frankivsk to participate in the Sobor (i.e. council) that will discuss the **"Vibrant Parish - The Place to Encounter the Living Christ!"**. We have been slowly implementing the goals of the *Vibrant Parish* initiative here in the Archeparchy of Winnipeg. However, the Synod of Bishops of our Church asked that all bishops convene a local sobor in the territory within their care in the year 2014 and that an all-

church sobor would be held later in 2015 so that we could all share our successes and needs and learn about the situation in all parts of the world. The goal is to study the results of our eparchial sobors, find similarities, note differences and yet draft a plan and set goals that would move our entire Ukrainian Catholic Church forward in today's world, according to the Will of God. By the grace of God, all delegations (which will be lead by their respective Bishops) including our small delegation from Winnipeg, will learn much and return with clear goals and renewed enthusiasm to share with us. Please pray that the Sobor will not only be a successful event and wonderful inspiration for the participants, but especially an event that will bring the Light of Christ to all the corners of the Earth where our brothers and sisters live, worship and Evangelize.

## Feast of the Beheading of John the Baptist (August 29th)

St. John the Baptizer was the last of the prophets, uniting the Old and the New Testaments. On August 29th is celebrated the last major feast of the church year, the martyrdom of John at the hands of Herod Antipas. John had condemned the marriage of Herod to Herodias, the wife of his half-brother. The Gospel of Matthew records the beheading of John at the request of the young daughter of Herodias, and the Roman historian Josephus also relates how Herod ordered his death because of his great popularity and the King's fear of an uprising of the people.

Celebration of the feast of the Beheading of John the Baptist dates to the fourth century A.D., correlating to the first finding of his head. Following his martyrdom, his disciples took and buried his body, but his head, which had been irreverently discarded by Herodias, was secretly taken by the venerable Joanna and buried on the Mount of Olives, where it remained forgotten for centuries. During the reign of Constantine the Great, John appeared to two monks in a dream and revealed the location of his head. It was unearthed, but later hidden and lost again.

It was discovered again in 452 A.D., again thanks to John appearing in a dream, and this time transferred to Constantinople. During the Iconoclastic wars of the 8th century it was hidden in Comana of Asia Minor, where John Chrysostom had died. It was discovered for the third time in 857 during the reign of Emperor Michael. Finally, during the Fourth Crusade (1204 A.D.) it disappeared, allegedly taken by crusaders to the West. At the present time several churches claim its possession, as do Muslims, who also honor John as a prophet and believe that his head is interred at the Umayyad Mosque in Damascus, Syria. <http://www.eriecountybyzantines.org/sf-beheading-jtb.html>



## Voting means using your judgment

Exercising the right to vote means making enlightened and well-thought-out judgments about the choices available. There are times, however, when these choices may prove very difficult. The Church reminds us that “in this context, it must be noted also that a well-formed Christian conscience does not permit one to vote for a political program or an individual law in which the fundamental content of faith and morals is replaced by the introduction of proposals differing from this content or opposing it.”

It is a sign of a healthy community when informed and responsible citizens engage in an ongoing dialogue on major social issues with their political leaders. This is precisely the kind of community we should strive to support and develop. No less is expected of us, since we are all called to be truly responsible for one another, especially for the most vulnerable members of our society.

### Examples of the application of Catholic moral and social teaching

This is one example of how Catholic moral and social teaching is to be applied. They do not constitute a political platform but a magnifying glass by which to analyze and evaluate public policies and programs.

#### 1. Respect for life and human dignity: from conception to natural death

Choosing life means:

Demanding the right to life for even the smallest among us – the human embryo and the foetus – since they too belong to the human family, while also providing assistance to pregnant women facing difficulties;

Respecting the life and dignity of the dying, accompanying them until their natural death and promoting greater access to palliative care;

Raising our voices against practices like physician-assisted suicide and euthanasia, which deny the intrinsic value of human life, endanger the lives of vulnerable people, and threaten to morally compromise medical professionals;

Protecting all persons from being exploited by biomedical technologies;

Rejecting capital punishment;

Defending and caring for individuals in all circumstances, beginning with the poorest and most vulnerable;

Supporting and accompanying individuals with disabilities, the elderly, the sick, the poor and those who are suffering.
