GOD BLESS WOMEN! GOD BLESS THE WOMEN IN OUR LIVES AND IN OUR PARISH! This celebration of International Women's Day (March 8) really has radical, even socialist, roots. It is not a Church-associated commemoration, but in recent years, Pope Francis has issued messages on the occasion of the annual commemoration that is marked in some countries - including his own Argentina. Although the day is often highjacked for radically misdirected and disappointingly presented causes, recognizing women in a special way is certainly a very positive endeavour. When we think of a special woman or women in our lives, we may think of wives and fiancees that make men better men and together with them grow in character, faith and wisdom. We may think of mothers to whom we are all

grateful for their bringing us into the world, caring for us and raising us. We may think of those who were our dedicated teachers and those women are our co-workers in various fields. We may think of grandmothers that have lived so much and who have given so much and, given a chance, would love to give whatever they can to their last day. We may think of the women of our parish who, as members of the UCWLC or simply as dedicated parishioners do so much for the good of our community year after year. Our heart also goes out to so many women that work and live in dire situations... women by the millions that are abused and exploited - around the world - and, yes, in our own country - by laws and culture that force them into situations and choices that often emotionally and spiritually scar them for life. Not even mentioning the billion-dollar pornography industry. Let us take this day in a positive light as we do other secular holidays like New Year and others - and honour the women in our lives as the Lord willed from the creation of the world. When the Lord created woman as a "helpmate" for man, He certainly didn't mean that she was to be man's "go for" or his "servant". Rather - a true partner that would help him reach his potential and fulfilment as he helps her. This is a day when we certainly can recognize how much women do for us personally and for the Church and the world. And give *them* thanks and thank *God* for everything that women do and for their incalculable contribution. We truly could not exist, we truly would not be the people that we are, without the many women in our lives.

BTW... The Church in Pope Francis' home country of Argentina has initiated a prayer novena of sorts as the country's government is threatening to pass sweeping anti-life legislation. The prayer vigil concludes today with a national pilgrimage and Mass at the nation's most famous shrine of Our Lady of Lujan. Their Women's Day campaign slogan is: "Yes to Women, Yes to Life!"



The Parish is in need of filling some key positions on the Parish Council, we are posting some of these key positions job descriptions so parishioners can see that, although these positions are very important to the operation of the parish, they are not out of the realm of volunteer duties:

Financial Chairperson: Responsible for the financial reports, signing authority, reviewing financial statements, Chair the Finance Committee, oversee parish investments, implement new ideas of financial gains for the parish (fund raising endeavors) and the overseeing of all pertinent financial matters (building repairs, purchase of new parish equipment/furniture, or all other purchases or sales). 1 hour a week maybe 2 to 3 hours (Committee meeting/Pastoral council)

Treasurer: Arrange money counters, record Sunday offerings accurately for office entry, make regular weekly bank deposits, sits on Finance Committee. 1 hour a week maybe 2 to 3 hours (Committee meeting/Pastoral council)

Sacristan: Various Church duties (lighting candles, incense etc.) preparing the altar and assisting Father Michael for funerals, weddings, baptisms and Sunday worship. This is a position that could be divided among 2 or 3 men if willing to work together.

Property Management Chair: Oversee and mange the Property Management Committee, attend Pastoral Council meetings, oversee the parish properties and see to it that any repairs are done in a timely fashion, work directly with the caretakers to maintain clean facilities. Oversee major repair (acquiring quotes, presenting major project to Pastoral Council). This can be a very demanding position but with the proper group on the committee could ease the time required.

Ushers/Greeters: To Greet the parishioners and guests on Sunday Divine Liturgies. What a great way to meet new people! This position could be as little as 4 times a year. Please call Parish office to be placed on the list.

Bartenders/Event Staff: We are always looking for new staff to join us. The busy season is around the corner, this is the time to sign up! Please leave your name with the parish office to be place on the list.

Introducing our newest 17 Wing Chaplain: Padre Sloboda

Padre Sloboda comes from the Ukrainian Catholic tradition and he is a Pastoral Associate with the Roman Catholic Military Ordinariate of Canada. He just returned from his intensive training at the Chaplain School at CFB Borden.

by Padre (Rabbi) Glogaver What was your experience as a child growing up in the militarized Soviet-Ukraine?

The Soviet-Ukraine was a quite a militarized culture. I remember, in secondary school during our physical fitness classes all children had to learn to throw mock aluminum made grenades for distance. In high school boys learned to assemble a Kalashnikov rifle and practiced shooting. My personal experience was even more unique because my birthday was on Soviet Army Commemoration Day, which used to be a very significant and serious

national holiday. One of the eccentric customs was that all the males received gifts from their female classmates

Regardless of that militarized environment, in childhood I never thought seriously about military service as a meaningful vocational pursuit. In the former Soviet Union, the military was predominantly seen as a repres sive institution that did not treat well its soldiers, and a mechanism to oppress the freedoms and rights of of citizens.

Could you share something about your journey to ministry?

My main inspiration to consider pastoral ministry came from my maternal grandfather Fr. Adam M. Morawski who was a Ukrainian Catholic priest. Because of his loyalty to the Catholic Church he was severely persecuted by communists. After WWII western Ukraine fell under Soviet rule and shortly after Stalin declared the Ukrainian Catholic Church as an illegal entity. Most of our clergy were either incarcerated, killed or they went into hiding. In 1949 my grandfather was arrested and together with his family they were shipped in a cargo train to a Gulag settlement in Siberia. They spent nine years in Siberia. Upon his return to the Ukraine. the Soviets would not allow him to function openly as a priest. Right up until passing, Fr. Adam ministered in clandestine conditions. I always admired my grandfather for his spiritual resiliency.

When Ukraine became free and religious education became possible, at age of fifteen I left home to join a minor seminary. Two years later I entered a major seminary of the Holy Spirit in Lyiv, the same institution that my grandfather attended prior to WWII. With the collapse of the Soviet Union the seminary reopened after being closed for more than half a century.

What brought you and your family to Canada?

When I finished my seminary program there were more graduating seminarians than my eparchy (diocese) could instantly ordain. Graduates were encouraged to seek additional education or to find something mean ingful to occupy themselves as they waited for priestly

My Ukrainian Catholic Church is blessed with many priestly vocations as they thrive on the memory of sac rifice during the twentieth century. The Church had proven itself as a trustworthy witness of Gospel values in times of persecution and this makes it attractive for many young people today.

As a seminarian, I was particularly interested in ecumenism, peace-building and interreligious dialogue. In 2005 I came to study at Master of Arts program in Conflict Studies at Saint Paul University in Ottawa. It seemed to me a perfect place to expand my knowledge and skills

What happened after Saint Paul University?

After I finished my MA program at Saint Paul University I was invited to work for the Canadian office of the Vatican agency · Catholic Near East Welfare Association (CNEWA). The agency focused on providing humanitarian and pastoral support for people in need in the Middle East and in Eastern Europe. I was with CNEWA for nine years. It was a real privilege to be supporting numerous communities that experienced hardships and challenges similar to those og my faith community.

Before coming to 17 Wing. I served for three years in various pastoral ministry capacities including health care, parish and correctional environments

How does it feel for you to serve in the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF)?

This is where I truly feel I belong. For about 10 years of my life I lived and studied in various Catholic seminaries. I must say that I felt quite comfortable functioning in these highly structured institutions. Military service reminds me to some extent of life in the seminary uniform, routines, sense of camaraderie with your team members, shared common mission and goals.

There is a long standing tradition of Ukrainian Canadians, including Ukrainian Catholic Chaplains, who served in the Canadian Armed Forces in both World Wars. I am proud to be following in their footsteps.
