COVID-19 PROVISIONARY PARISH WEEKLY UPDATE - NO. 8

Dear Parishioners,

We find ourselves in a very busy and hopeful week and yet one that is still hampered by uncertainty. There is talk and even reports of some changes to the social restrictions, but what are they exactly and how will they affect church life? We still need clarification and it will certainly be forthcoming in the near future. As of the preparation of this weekly update, there has been no change to the directives that govern pastoral activity in the Archeparchy. Having said that, however, we still have a lot going on!

The prayer life of our parish continues as it always has even throughout the Pandemic.... and then some! We have daily **Divine Liturgy** at 9:00 AM and even twice on Sunday at 8:00 AM and 10:00 AM as we maintain the Ukrainian Divine Liturgy for those that have requested this (and the numbers of those that participate online makes it well worth it). We have daily **Marian Devotions** throughout May at 7:00 PM. We have added a **Holy Hour** on every Wednesday and Friday at 6:00 PM that is not only broadcast online, but may be attended by small numbers of people if they call in ahead of time (the number is limited to 10, so we don't want people coming to a locked church, because the number has been surpassed). Of course, we continue to have our church open for well over an hour on Sundays from 11:00 AM for those that want to come by to visit the church and to receive Holy Communion.

The **Holy Rosary** is prayed *daily* prior to each Divine Liturgy. For the last 10 days of May, we are having "**Mission Days**" reflections following the daily evening Molebens during which we contemplate the Lord's mandate and the role of each and everyone of us in Evangelizing the world around us.


There is the 22nd annual Walk for Mary on Sunday, May 31 beginning at 2:00 PM Then, on top of everything, we are excited about the approaching feast of PENTECOST! This "birthday of the Church" at which every year we renew our own personal and collective enthusiasm for the Church into which we have all been baptized! This coming Sunday let's celebrate and explore creative ways in which we can engage in Evangelization with the Pandemic and in the post-Pandemic reality!

While we were sheltering in place...?

The Head of the Ukrainian Catholic Church, His Beatitude **Sviatoslav**, together with the lead Roman Catholic Bishop in Ukraine, issued a type of open letter to the government that deals with, what he refers to as one of several illnesses now infecting the world... You will find this interesting (and kind of shocking) The Coronavirus pandemic has brought to light **many** diseases in the life of contemporary society. One of these is surrogate motherhood, that is, treating people like merchandise which can be ordered, manufactured, and sold. Unfortunately, this is permitted by current Ukrainian legislation.



As religious leaders, we have repeatedly drawn the attention of the competent state authorities to this problem. Such trampling on human dignity compels us, the Catholic Bishops of Ukraine, to appeal to the Ukrainian authorities on all levels, once again, to condemn and ban this shameful phenomenon.

In recent days, we witnessed a video posted on the BioTexCom clinic page from the Venice Hotel in Kyiv, which shows a makeshift children's room and 46 crying babies in beds. **These newborns were in modern incubators, deprived of maternal touch, parental warmth, selfless care, and much-needed love.** They were shown as a purchased product for <u>no-show buyers</u>. Such a demonstration of contempt for the dignity of the human person is difficult to contemplate. And all this is made possible by legalized surrogate motherhood.

Legalization of the so-called surrogate motherhood, which should never be called "motherhood," not only involves the horrible phenomena recently shown on video, but also an underlying moral evil that brings immeasurable suffering and persecution to both the child and to the woman who bore it, to members of her family, and to those who produce children as if they were pets.

Of its essence, the practice of surrogate motherhood, its qualities, purpose, and means, are morally unacceptable. The same applies to the so-called altruistic surrogate motherhood, which has the same moral value. For even if the intention of the surrogate mother is good, the means and the object itself are bad. The commercial basis of surrogate motherhood deserves even harsher assessment, from a moral point of view, because it adds the moral evil of buying and selling functions of the body and of the person of the newborn child. No circumstances or consequences can justify the practice of surrogate motherhood.

Every child is a gift of God that should be gratefully accepted in married life. Every child has the right to be conceived naturally, and every child has the right to be born into a family and to be brought up in an atmosphere of love by father and mother. Surrogate motherhood severely violates these rights and makes it impossible for Ukraine to follow the path of development, the path of the great European heritage. Such a gap in Ukrainian legislation significantly destroys European integration efforts and discredits our country in the eyes of European society.

We stand in solidarity with the Commissioner for Human Rights of the Ukrainian Parliament's appeal to ban international child trafficking in Ukraine at the legislative level. We exhort and demand the banning of surrogate motherhood in any form (altruistic and commercial) and to assure to newborn children proper protection and the possibility to be adopted into families.

We reinforce this appeal by condemning a number of international institutions for this shameful phenomenon, which we present in the appendix to this letter.

We also demand that the state authority finally pays attention to family policy in Ukraine: that it creates an appropriate government body that could take care of Ukrainian families; that it ensures that Ukrainian mothers do not have to trade their bodies and the children they carry within for their own survival and that of their families.

HOLY HOURS & CHURCH VISITS

As we begin the slow, cautious crawl "out the catacombs", we want to do so first of all with our Lord and under His guidance. Therefore, we want to begin in the very heart of our Parish - at our Church! Starting this week we will begin to have our Church open for "individual visits" where we will maintain the provincial regulation of not more than 10 people at a time. [therefore: Phoning in ahead to "pre-register" will be required] The use of hand sanitizer and disinfectant and masks will be the rule and, especially "social distancing" of six feet at any given time. The church will be marked with directional arrows - please follow them in and out of the Church and when moving within the Church. The Church will be marked as where visitors may sit/kneel to pray. Those of one household that come together may sit together, but only if their group does not cross into the social distancing parameters of other visitors. If so, then single-household groups must separate to different markers so that distance is maintained.

Sundays - from 11:00 AM to 12:20 PM - with the opportunity for Holy Communion / and Confession

Wednesdays - from 6:00 PM to 7:00 PM - with the opportunity for Confession

Fridays - from 6:00 PM to 7:00 PM - with the opportunity for Confession
