COVID-19 PROVISIONARY PARISH WEEKLY UPDATE - NO. 13

Hey, Friends, We need to talk and we *really* need to pray....

There is a lull in the wind and thunder of the mounting 21st Century storm that has been ebbing and flowing in like a slowly growing ocean hurricane. It is a good time to take stock of where we are at and how prepared we are to weather the storm together. The good news (actually, yes, the **Good News**) is that the Lord is with us and wants us to remain calm, not to be afraid, because He will see us through. We just need to stay close to Him and do exactly what He says. The not-so-good-news is that it's going to be a bit of a rough journey and we will experience and witness things that may sadden us and may even scare us a bit. As Catholic Christians we couldn't help but notice that well before the Pandemic hit we saw things that were worrying. We saw a slow loss of faith... we saw things like abortion, MAID and gender politics become more prevalent and accepted - or just pushed on society. We have seen politics evolve from the occasional passionate debate and disappointing election and so-called "agreeing to disagree" to such stark differences that threaten to not only sharply divide people, but even provoke hatred and violence. This is already seen very clearly across our southern border and other European countries. The Covid-19 Pandemic was declared and western society has been turned upside-down. Not only have we all been traumatized for ourselves and for those about whom we care - family members, fellow parishioners and perfect strangers about whom we heard on the news. The numbers of infected rose and so did the mortality rate reports. Could we catch the virus? Could we become ill and even die? Then there were the strict regulations. Then there was the economic hardship. Businesses lost. Jobs lost. Events cancelled. Contact with loved ones blocked. The heartbreak of not being able to touch or comfort or even see relatives and friends. And it seems to be easing up, but... its not over yet.

Then we have front row seats to social upheaval and unrest in news in far away places, but perhaps soon coming to a neighbourhood near us. The sad thing is that we see people violently bent on change, but it seems with no clear direction as to how it will be better than fixing what is broken. Things are being torn down (literally and figuratively) and there doesn't seem to be a plan of what better to replace it with. Our ancestors in the old country saw this happen before. That is why many of our pioneers escaped to the West. Is it all repeating itself again?

So what can we do? What should we do? Yes, we must be informed about the truth of what is happening around us, but we especially need to pray. By prayer we align ourselves with the Lord. By prayer we obtain the wisdom (*informed wisdom, not irrelevant opinions*) from the Lord. By prayer we grow in grace and virtue. By prayer we can move the hearts, minds and souls of those around us - our neighbours and our leaders. By prayer we will grow in holiness and true kindness. By prayer, we will be tuned into the voice of God. But real, daily and unceasing prayer. If, and only if, OUR lives change will we have any influence in changing the life of the world around us...we can do this!

What to do...

1. Offer a prayer of thanksgiving to the Lord that we are able to slowly return to our beloved parish church. AND pray that the Holy Spirit will guide and watch over our return that we will be cautious and that everyone will understand the importance of following the protocols.

2. Read the full text of the Archeparchial reopening **Covid-19 Directive #5** and the accompanying **Commentary** on the Archeparchial website at www.archeparchy.ca.

3. Ask yourself the usual safety **questions** and if, and only if you have read the Archeparchial Covid-19 Directives and Commentaries AND you can answer "No" to following four questions, and you would like to attend a service or visit the church, then call the parish to "preregister". The four questions are:

▶ Did I travel by air in the past **two weeks**? ▶ Have I been close to someone infected with COVID-19?

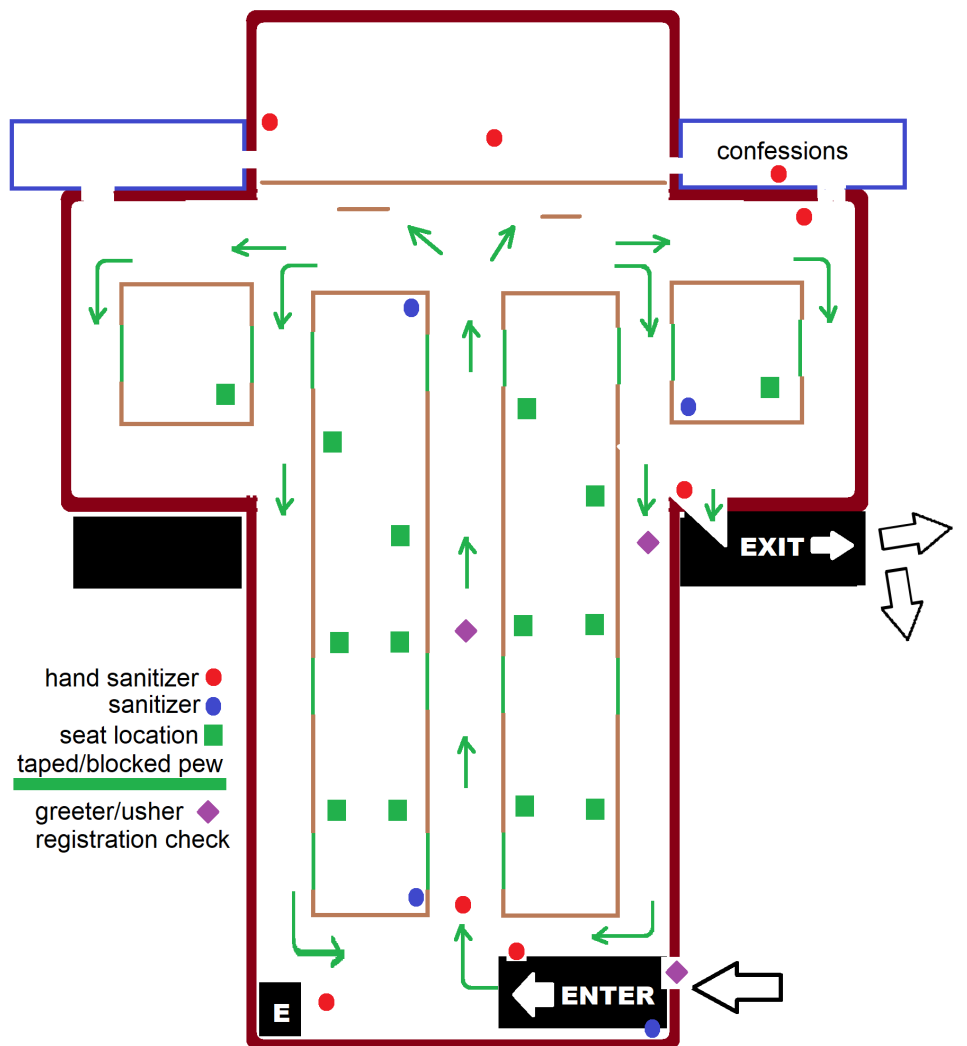
▶ Is anyone in my household quarantined or in isolation? ▶ Do I have a cough, fever, shortness of breath, runny nose, or sore throat?

4. You can **pre-register** to participate in a **Sunday Divine Liturgy** for yourself (and other family members) by calling the parish office **204-667-8866** and letting the Office Manager know or by leaving a message by the end of the office day on THURSDAY. You will need to clarify **which Divine Liturgy** you would like to attend [8:00 am or 10:00 am], **who** will be attending [name and contact number] and confirm that you can answer the **safety questions** negatively. As of today, **only 50 persons** (including clergy, singers and ushers) so when that number is met for each Liturgy, no more pre-registrations will be accepted.

5. It would be wise to arrive at the church **at least 10 minutes prior** to the service.

6. **Follow all the instructions** given by the ushers and the presiding member of the clergy. Keep in mind... use **hand sanitizer** when entering the church and when leaving.... keep at a **distance of 6-feet** from other individuals at all times... follow the directional **arrows** (*forward only up the middle and back only by the sides*)... sit only in "open" pews and at a spot tagged by **green tape**... individuals *from the same household* may sit in one pew... help to sanitize your own spot (seat and the top/back of the pew in front of you)... wearing a **mask** or having one to use is very much *encouraged*... there is **one entrance** and a **different exit**... (with the exception of those who need the handicap elevator)... **no socializing** can be permitted at this time in the church or in the church parking lot (there will be a time soon enough)...

It's not that complicated, but we want to be slow and sure and careful for everyone's sake...
