

How can we best collaborate with our Parish Priest?



Well.... Church Law - i.e. Canon Law - gives some basic and some great ideas...

Regardless of his age, health or experience, a parish priest is appointed by the Bishop to be the shepherd of the souls (i.e. of all the parishioners and other people around the parish) that are entrusted to his care (Canon 281 - §1). That is an

awesome responsibility! It is a joyful, but also daunting task. That is why it is so important that everyone understands how serious that is and tries with all they have to make it successful! The law also helps by laying out the most basic duties and goals of a parish priest. In Canon 289, the Church reminds ua that a priest has three basic functions - to **lead** us, **teach** us and make us holy (i.e. **sanctify** us)! This long canon breaks it down to three paragraphs. Let's paraphrase them...

As a **TEACHER** - the priest is obliged to preach the Word of God to everyone so that they may grow in faith, hope and charity so that they would be always more rooted in Christ and that they will better reflect the love that Jesus showed us and commanded us to show the whole world day by day. The Parish Priest will also find a way to teach the faith and the "mysteries of Salvation" in the parish - by Catechism programs, adult faith exploration, Bible studies. This same paragraph says that, of course he should get all the help that he needs from paroshioners, Sisters and other means like social media programs and resources.

A one striving to **SANCTIFY** us - the priest will make the Eucharistic Liturgy the heart of parish life and activity. The Divine Liturgy is the "center and culmination of the whole life" of the parish. Of course, the Sacraments are so important in this and he will strive that they are available frequently, especially Confession and Holy Communion, but also we want to approach him for the Sacraments of Initiation and Marriage. Prayer life is so important - Molebens and Akafists, and prayer groups, but, in particular the "Divine Praises" like the Hours, Matins, Vespers, etc. To make all this happen, the parish priest has the right to ask for the help of singers, servers, even other priests and a liturgical team as some parishes have.

Finally, as a **Leader** - our priest wants to "know hos flock" and to do this he needs to be in contact, and his flock needs to be in touch with him and let him know their needs and what's going on in their lives and families. He will try to keep the "flock" together and make sure that everyone knows that they are wanted and are an essential part of the parish. Some may prefer to take a "back-bencher" role or live their parish life inconspicuously, but the pastor and people need to work together to bring out the best in eachother for bigger success of the mission of the parish and the Church of which it is a part. The canon says that the priest is to "visit the homes and schools" as required... take a special interest in "adolescents and children"... to be a loving father for "the poor and sick"... "have a special care" for workers and one of his ongoing goals is to get the whole parish to be active and dedicated to give assistance (by volunteering and helping out materially) for the "works of the apostolate". It sounds like a lot, but the idea of the canon is not only to delineate the tasks of the parish priest, but to make it clear that we're all in it together and that is the only way it is going to work. May the Lord grant those parishes that still have a permanent, onsite parish priest the grace and wisdom and enthusiasm to make great things happened as needed in the times in which we live! **God IS with us!**


