There is a chapter with Dostoyevsky's famous book "The Brothers Karamazov" which outlines a terrible fiction of a 'Grand Inquisitor' who has continued a long legacy of trying to "clean up the mess" that Christ made when He came and walked the earth and offered men freedom. The story takes place in Spain at the height of the Inquisition, and Christ returns briefly to visit His people as He did before. The people flock to Him and rejoice and He cures the blind and raises the dead. The Grand Inquisitor however has Him arrested again and imprisoned. Christ does not say a word as the Inquisitor explains that there is no room for Him and the freedom He offers to His people in this church that has secretly made a pact with the devil. The people want happiness, not freedom, and the Inquisitor has worked hard to trade them an easy life ending in death in the name of Christ, as opposed to one of moral responsibility, suffering and struggle, leading eventually to everlasting life. The Master has returned to His Church and is not wanted and is slated yard and preach HIS Gospel.

for execution in the morning. Christ offers no defense but only smiles at his judge and kisses him. In response we read that the Inquisitor expels Him and He goes away.

The story is a great warning to us brothers and sisters, as is our Gospel reading today. We are stewards of the Lord's vineyard, not the owners. The Church is the vineyard which Christ the Lord planted, we are the care-takers. The Gospel we preach is His, not our own, and so we are faced with a choice of tending His Vineyard or building our own Babels. The news of the terrible sex-abuse scandals that have recently emerged from the States is staggering. We see here clear examples of systemic abuse from the stewards who deliberately and knowingly misused their authority to "steal the fruits" of the Master to build their own little kingdoms. Many of them have avoided justice in this world, but they will stand before the Lord and give an account, as we all must.

The question remains for us in Christ's Church however. How would we react if the Master returned? Would we be welcoming of Christ's return to His Church, or would we let Him know that "we already have everything under control" and so we don't need Him? This week, recommit yourself to the awesome freedom Christ has given to us, His Church, and keep the many victims of abuse and their families in your prayers. Also, pray especially for the clergy that they may be good and truthful stewards of the Lord's vine-


