Brothers and Sisters, by faith Moses, when he became of age, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter, choosing rather to suffer affliction with the people of God than to enjoy the passing pleasures of sin, esteeming the reproach of Christ greater riches than the treasures in Egypt; for he looked to the reward. And what more shall I say? For the time would fail me to tell of Gideon and Barak and Samson and Jephthah, also of David and Samuel and the prophets: who through faith subdued kingdoms,

worked righteousness, obtained promises, stopped the mouths of lions, quenched the violence of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, out of weakness were made strong, became valiant in battle, turned to flight the armies of the aliens. They wandered about in sheepskins and goatskins, being destitute, afflicted, tormented— of whom the world was not worthy. They wandered in deserts and mountains, in dens and caves of the earth. And all these, having obtained a good testimony through faith, did not receive the promise, God having provided something better for us, that they should not be made perfect apart from us. Therefore we also, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.



Summary of Recent Directives from Metropolitan Lawrence **Regarding COVID-19**

- Masks are still required.
- There are no capacity limits.
- The usual manner in which we take up the Sunday Collection can resume.
- Altar Servers and Girls of Mary may resume with the permission of parents.
- Holy water fonts (if applicable) can be restored.
- Live-streaming is to continue if possible
- The general dispensation from the fundamental obligation to participate in the Sunday and Feast Day (day of obligation) Divine Liturgy is rescinded.
- These changes will surely bring a goodly amount of joy to the hearts of all of us as we can now slowly start to revitalize parish pastoral and social activity. However, not a few will feel a sense of hesitancy to rush into pre-pandemic situations and understandably so. We must be cognisant of the concerns of parishioners who will want to re-enter according to their personal experience and concerns. As always, due respect toward everyone and fundamental Christian charity will be the right approach.
- We don't know what the future holds. In fact, the latest Public Health Order runs only until March15. However, we want to move forward with cautious optimism praying the Lord to watch over us and guide us. May we focus on experiencing the Great Fast as fully as possible as we prepare for the celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord. Needless to say, we in particular want to raise our prayer to our Lord for our brothers and sisters in Ukraine at this terrifying time of trial.

UPDATED GUIDELINES
