Twenty-five years ago in the church of St. Basil in Edmonton, His Grace, Metropolitan Lawrence was ordained to serve the Church as the Bishop of the Edmonton Eparchy by Metropolitan Michael Bzdel (Winnipeg), Bishop Severian Yakymyshyn (New Westminster), and Bishop Cornelius Pasichny (Toronto).

This year also marks sixteen (16) years that Most Rev. Lawrence has served as the Metropolitan-Archbishop of Winnipeg. A larger event of commemoration and thanksgiving is being planned for later this year when circumstances permit.
