On the last day, that great day of the feast, Jesus stood and cried out, saying, "If anyone thirsts, let him come to Me and drink. He who believes in Me, as the Scripture has said, out of his heart will flow rivers of living water." But this He spoke concerning the Spirit, whom those believing in Him would receive; for the Holy Spirit was not yet given, because Jesus was not yet glorified. Therefore many from the crowd, when they heard this saying, said,

"Truly this is the Prophet." Others said, "This is the Christ." But some said, "Will the Christ come out of Galilee? Has not the Scripture said that the Christ comes from the seed of David and from the town of Bethlehem, where David was?" So there was a division among the people because of Him. Now some of them wanted to take Him, but no one laid hands on Him. Then the officers came to the chief priests and Pharisees, who said to them, "Why have you not brought Him?" The officers answered, "No man ever spoke like this Man!" Then the Pharisees answered them, "Are you also deceived? Have any of the rulers or the Pharisees believed in Him? But this crowd that does not know the law is accursed." Nicodemus (he who came to Jesus by night, being one of them) said to them, "Does our law judge a man before it hears him and knows what he is doing?" They answered and said to him, "Are you also from Galilee? Search and look, for no prophet has arisen out of Galilee." Then Jesus spoke to them again, saying, "I am the light of the world. He who follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but have the light of life."

Did you know?

There is no doubt that Eastern Christians have a beautiful love for the Most Holy God-bearer (Theotokos) and Mother of God. This evidenced in the many hymns that in song magnify her, in the icons throughout the church building, especially on the iconostasis and in the church apsidal dome, that reveal her important role in salvation history, and in our communal and personal prayer. At Holy Eucharist Parish, we have taken to a special devotion to the Mother of God that originated in the Latin Catholic Church—the Rosary. We have been accustomed to praying this prayer before the Divine Liturgy on Sundays. And I believe that we need to continue with this. I would like to make one small change. With the pubication of the UGCC Catechism, *Christ Our Pascha*, in 2106, there came an official



translation of the prayer to the Mother of God used in the Rosary. I would like us to move to that translation starting September 1, 2022, the Church New Year. So I provide the official translation below so you cam become familiar with it

Rejoice, Mother of God, Virgin Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you. Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb; for you have borne Christ, the Saviour and Redeemer of our souls.
