Troparia and Kontakia

Troparion, Tone 4: When the disciples of the Lord learned from the angel* the glorious news of the resurrection* and cast off the ancestral condemnation,* they proudly told the apostles:* "Death has been plundered!* Christ our God is risen,* granting to the world great mercy."

Troparion, Tone 4: Leaving behind worldly tumult,* O Venerable Father Anthony,* in keeping with the gospel you turned your back on the world,* and leading a life equal to that of angels you attained to the calm haven of Mount Athos* from whence you came to the Mount of Kiev* with the Fathers' blessing* and living there an arduous life you enlightened your fatherland,* pointing the way into the Kingdom on high to a multitude of monks and nuns* and thus you lead your homeland to Christ.* Pray to Him that He save our souls.

Epistle - Rm 10:1-10; Gal 5:22-6:2

Brothers and Sisters, my heart's desire and prayer to God for Israel is that they may be saved. For I bear them witness that they have a zeal for God, but not according to knowledge. For they being ignorant of God's righteousness, and seeking to establish their own righteousness, have not submitted to the righteousness of God. For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to everyone who believes. For Moses writes about the righteousness which is of the law, "The man who does those things shall live by them." But the righteousness of faith speaks in this way, "Do not say in your heart, 'Who will ascend into heaven?" (that is, to bring Christ down from above) or, "Who will descend into the abyss?" (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead). But what does it say? "The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart" (that is, the word of faith which we preach): that if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.

Brothers and Sisters, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control. Against such there is no law. And those who are Christ's have crucified the flesh with its passions and



At that time, when Jesus had come to the other side, to the country of the Gergesenes, there met Him two demonpossessed men, coming out of the tombs, exceedingly fierce, so that no one could pass that way. And suddenly they cried out, saying, "What have we to do with You, Jesus, You Son of God? Have You come here to torment us before the time?" Now a good way off from them there was a herd of many swine feeding. So the demons begged Him, saying, "If You cast us out, permit us to go away into the herd of swine." And He said to them, "Go." So when they had come out, they went into the herd of swine. And suddenly the whole herd of swine ran violently down the steep place into the sea, and perished in



the water. Then those who kept them fled; and they went away into the city and told everything, including what had happened to the demon-possessed men. And behold, the whole city came out to meet Jesus. And when they saw Him, they begged Him to depart from their region. So He got into a boat, crossed over, and came to His own city.

At that time, Jesus came down with them and stood on a level place with a crowd of His disciples and a great multitude of people from all Judea and Jerusalem, and from the seacoast of Tyre and Sidon, who came to hear Him and be healed of their diseases, as well as those who were tormented with unclean spirits. And they were healed. And the whole multitude sought to touch Him, for power went out from Him and healed them all.

Then He lifted up His eyes toward His disciples, and said: "Blessed are you poor, for yours is the kingdom of God. Blessed are you who hunger now, for you shall be filled. Blessed are you who weep now, for you shall laugh. Blessed are you when men hate you, and when they exclude you, and revile you, and cast out your name as evil, for the Son of Man's sake. Rejoice in that day and leap for joy! For indeed your reward is great in heaven, for in like manner their fathers did to the prophets.

The **Synods of Bishop of the Ukrainian Catholic Church** will take place from July 7-15 in Przemyśl (Peremyshl), Poland.

The Holy Father, Pope Francis, is coming to Canada July 24-29, 2022. His visit will provide an opportunity for him to listen and dialogue with Indigenous Peoples, to express his heartfelt closeness and to address the impact of residential schools in Canada. The papal visit will also provide an opportunity for the shepherd of the world's 1.2 billion Catholics to connect with the Catholic community in Canada. We ask for your prayers for a blessed visit. Please consider the following petitions in your personal prayer:

- 1. We pray for the health of Pope Francis as he prepares to visit Canada in July. May God bless the Holy Father with the strength and stamina to travel to our country for a visit of healing, hope and reconciliation.
- 2. We pray for the Papal Visit to Canada this July. May the journey serve as a moment of healing and reconciliation for Indigenous Elders, knowledge keepers, residential school survivors, and all those working on the path to truth and understanding.

A General Chapter of the Basilian Order of Saint Josaphat will take place in Rome from July 11-23, at which time a new General Superior will be elected. We pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit during the General Chapter.

For those wishing to **donate to Ukraine**, you can do so through the Ukrainian Canadian Congress Manitoba Branch at gofundme.com and search #HelpUkraineNow, or through the Catholic Near East Welfare Association (cnewa.org/ca/campaigns/ukraine). There are direct links on the parish website. Or you can donate to our parish and earmark for Ukraine. We will forward your donation to CNEWA.

As more and more refugees arrive into Winnipeg from war-torn Ukraine, the local Manitoba Branch of the Ukrainian Canadian Congress is in need of more **volunteers**. They are asking for more people to come forward to help the newcomers settle in and "learn the

ropes" and just be a friend or a contact to explain and guide them through the challenging nuances of life in a new land. If you can spare some time - at least maybe inquire to find out if this is for you - contact the U.C.C. volunteer office now at 204-942-9348. Ukrainian speaking volunteers to act as *language assistants* for those coming to the UCC-MPC Reception Hub at the Best Western Airport Hotel (Wellington Ave) to help provide a warm welcome to newcomers. Volunteers help connect people to Ukrainian community resources. The Reception Hub is open 6 days per week (Monday-Saturday) and hours vary day to day and go into the evening on some days.

Ukrainian Park is selling seasonal passes for persons enjoying and using the park for recreational purposes. If you have a lease with the park a pass will be provided. The seasonal pass fee is a nominal for the season. This will aid with the upkeep and maintenance of the park. Motor vehicles are required to display a valid Ukrainian Park vehicle pass while visiting the Park. Motorcyclists must as well have a valid park entry pass in their possession. Park passes must show the matching vehicle license plate number and be clearly displayed in the vehicle's windshield. Passes will be available at the park and staff will accept cash or cheque for purchase of pass. If you would like to purchase a pass e-transfer please contact parkdiwith rect@archeparchy.ca. This process requires 48hr notice.
