and they were not afraid of the king's command.

And what more shall I say? For the time would fail me to tell of Gideon and Barak and Samson and Jephthah, also of David and Samuel and the prophets: who through faith subdued kingdoms, worked righteousness, obtained promises, stopped the mouths of lions, quenched the violence of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, out of weakness were made strong, became valiant in battle, turned to flight the armies of the aliens. Women received their dead raised to life again. Others were tortured, not accepting deliverance, that they might obtain a better resurrection. Still others had trial of mockings and scourgings, yes, and of chains and imprisonment. They were stoned, they were sawn in two, were tempted, were slain with the sword. They wandered about in sheepskins and goatskins, being destitute, afflicted, tormented— of whom the world was not worthy. They wandered in deserts and mountains, in dens and caves of the earth. And all these, having obtained a good testimony through faith, did not receive the promise, God having provided something better for us, that they should not be made perfect apart from us.

The book of the genealogy of Jesus Christ, the Son of David, the Son of Abraham: Abraham begot Isaac, Isaac begot Jacob, and Jacob begot Judah and his brothers. Judah begot Perez and Zerah by Tamar, Perez begot Hezron, and Hezron begot Ram. Ram begot Amminadab, Amminadab begot Nahshon, and Nahshon begot Salmon. Salmon begot Boaz by Rahab, Boaz begot Obed by Ruth, Obed begot Jesse, and Jesse begot David the king. David the king begot Solomon by her who had been the wife of Uriah. Solomon begot Rehoboam, Rehoboam begot Abijah, and Abijah begot Asa. Asa begot Jehoshaphat, Jehoshaphat begot Joram, and Joram begot Uzziah. Uzziah begot

Jotham, Jotham begot Ahaz, and Ahaz begot Hezekiah. Hezekiah begot Manasseh, Manasseh begot Amon, and Amon begot Josiah. Josiah begot Jeconiah and his brothers about the time they were carried away to Babylon. And after they were brought to Babylon, Jeconiah begot Shealtiel, and Shealtiel begot Zerubbabel. Zerubbabel begot Abiud, Abiud begot Eliakim, and Eliakim begot Azor. Azor begot Zadok, Zadok begot Achim, and Achim begot Eliud. Eliud begot Eleazar, Eleazar begot Matthan, and Matthan begot Jacob. And Jacob begot Joseph the husband of Mary, of whom was born Jesus who is called Christ. So all the generations from Abraham to David are fourteen generations, from David until the captivity in Babylon arefourteen generations, and from the captivity in Babylon until the Christ are fourteen generations. Now the birth of Jesus Christ was as follows: After His mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, before they came together, she was found with child of the Holy Spirit. Then Joseph her husband, being a just man, and not wanting to make her a public example, was minded to put her away secretly. But while he thought about these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take to you Mary your wife, for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit. And she will bring forth a Son, and you shall call His name JESUS, for He will save His people from their sins." So all this was done that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the Lord through the prophet, saying: "Behold, the virgin shall be with child, and bear a Son, and they shall call His name Immanuel," which is translated, "God with us." Then Joseph, being aroused from sleep, did as the angel of the Lord commanded him and took to him his wife, and did not know her till she had brought forth her firstborn Son. And he called His name JESUS.

A special session for **Confession** will be this Friday evening, from 6:00-9:00 pm in he church. You can find a preparation guide to Confession at the back of the church.



Was Jesus Christ actually born on December 25?



Christians have been trying to figure that out since the third century! There are two theories as to how we arrive at the date of December 25. The first theory held that the historically accurate date of Christ's Passion was March 25. Continuing the Judaic belief that the conception date and date of death was the same for the religiously important, they added nine months to March 25 and arrived at December 25. This theory may hold some water, but the second theory is more probable.

In the Roman Empire, there was a pagan feast called Natalis Solis Invicti (Invincible Sun-God) honouring the pagan sun-god, Emesa. It was celebrated on the December 25, the day of the winter solstice (the day of the longest darkness, after this date, the days would become longer). In order to minimize the attraction of Christians to this pagan festival, the feast of the Nativity was celebrated on the same day. Recalling from the prophet Malachi, the early Christians knew Christ as the 'sun of righteousness:' "But for you who fear my name the sun of righteousness shall rise, with healing in his wings. You shall go forth leaping like calves from the stall" (4:2). They also recalled that Christ called Himself the "light of the world" (In. 8:12), and that He is the "true light that enlightens every man who was to come into the world" (Jn. 1:9). The winter solstice then was the perfect time for Christians to celebrating the True Light breaking forth into the darkness of the world.

So, you see, Christmas is much more than just a birthday celebration for our Lord Jesus. It is a celebration of the **Light** breaking forth into the darkness of this world of sin and despair! It is a celebration of the **Sun of Righteousness** rising and showing with what beauty the world was created! It is a celebration of **God-with-us** (*Z namy Bob*)! It is the celebration of the **beginning of our redemption**!
