

Our Goal is \$40,000 by December 15!

Holy Eucharist Parish took advantage of the federal government offered CEBA (Canadian Emergency Business Account) interest-free loan program in order to keep the parish and its buildings functioning during the time when our regular means of supporting ourselves financially had been severely restricted (e.g., functions at the Parish Centre, perogy production and sales, regular donations, etc.) during the pandemic. The amount of the loan was \$60,000. The was approved by the Parish Pastoral Council, the then-pastor, Fr. Michael Kwiatkowski, and Metropolitan Lawrence.

The government has extended the deadline for the loan repayment to December 31, 2023. If we repay \$40,000 of the CEBA loan prior to December 31, 2023, we will receive \$20,000 loan forgiveness. If we do not repay \$40,000 by December 31, 2023, we will need to repay full \$60,000 plus interest—at 5% per annum that will work out to \$66,296.48—which would be due on December 31, 2025.

This is an appeal to all our parishioners and friends to consider increasing donations. Equally as important, please share your fundraising ideas so we can successfully repay this reduced amount on time. You can place your fundraising ideas in the Sunday collection basket—please address them to the Parish Pastoral Council (please do not place your suggestion in your Sunday offering envelope—use a separate envelope).


Please, take this to our Lord in prayer—ask the Lord how you can help; and don't hesitate to help. We will take care of these things—together.
