Troparia and Kontakia

Troparion, Tone 5: Let us the faithful acclaim and worship the Word,* co-eternal with the Father and the Spirit,* and born of the Virgin for our salvation.* For He willed to be lifted up on the cross in the flesh, to suffer death* and to raise the dead by His glorious resurrection.

Troparion, Tone 2: We bow before Your most pure image, O kind Lord,* and beg pardon for our sins, O Christ our God.* Of Your own will You consented to ascend the Cross in the flesh to free Your handiwork from enslavement to the enemy.* In thanksgiving we cry aloud to You:* by coming to save the world, our Saviour, You filled all things with joy.

Kontakion, Tone 8: The uncircumscribed Word of the Father* became circumscribed when He took flesh of you, O Mother of God,* and when He restored the divine image to its ancient glory,* He suffused it with the beauty of God.* Therefore, confessing our salvation in deed and word,* we portray it in images.

Blessed are You, Lord God of our fathers,* and praised and glorified is Your Name for ever.

verse: For You are righteous in everything You have done to us.

Epistle - Heb 11:24-26,32-40; 12:1-2

accepting deliverance, that they might obtain a better resurrection. Still others had trial of mockings and scourgings, yes, and of chains and imprisonment. They were stoned, they were sawn in two, were tempted, were slain with the sword. They wandered about in sheepskins and goatskins, being destitute, afflicted, tormented—of whom the world was not worthy. They wandered in deserts and mountains, in dens and caves of the earth. And all these, having obtained a good testimony through faith, did not receive the promise, God having provided something better for us, that they should not be made perfect apart from us. Therefore we also, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.

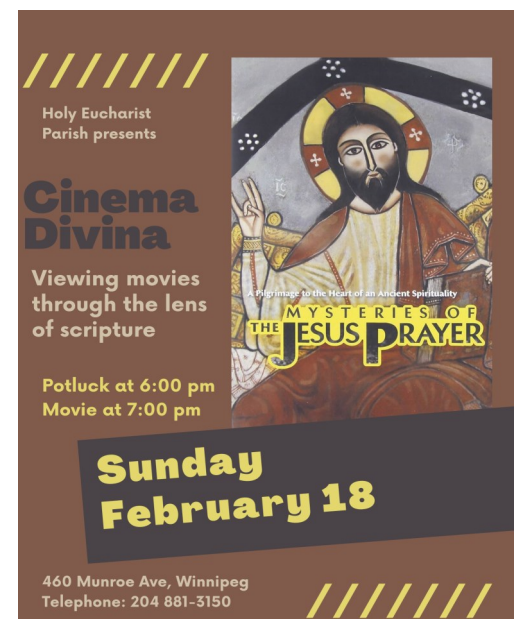

The events will take place in Winnipeg, Manitoba, from February 23 to 25, 2024, and will include a screening of "Twenty Days in Mariupol", the Oscar nominated documentary, at the Franco-Manitobain Cultural Center on Friday, February 23, at 6:30PM. A Moleben for Peace service will be celebrated at St. Mary the Protectress Ukrainian Orthodox Church at 11AM, followed by a procession and a Panakhyda (requiem) service at Sts. Ask Fr. Mike...

What is the priesthood of the baptised?

Good question! I've been speaking about this in my homilies for about two years. The author, Gillian Crow, puts it this way: "The Church is the gathering of the *laos*, the whole people of God. A lay person is not, as in the popular usage of the word 'layman,' an amateur or an ignoramus. Instead, a lay person has the highest status, which all the baptized share: "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people," as St Peter says in his first epistle [1 Pt 2:9]. When we are chrismated, we are sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit as king, prophet, and priest, becoming fully initiated members of the Body of Christ, who is King, Prophet, and Priest, whether we are adults, children, or infants.

The veneration of the Holy Icons is based on fundamental Christology, on our belief in the incarnation of the Son of God, and on our understanding of salvation for the Holy Mother of God and the saints. In the Incarnation, God did not simply speak to us, or come to us intellectually; *God became Man. The Second Person of the Holy Trinity, God the Son, by the Will of His Father and the cooperation of the Holy Spirit, took on Himself a human nature in the body of the Blessed Virgin Mary, who thus became Theotokos, the Holy Mother of God.*
