Gospel - John 12:1-18

Six days before the Passover, Jesus came to Bethany, where Lazarus was who had been dead, whom He had raised from the dead. There they made Him a supper; and Martha served, but Lazarus was one of those who sat at the table with Him. Then Mary took a pound of very costly oil of spikenard, anointed the feet of Jesus, and wiped His feet with her hair. And the house

was filled with the fragrance of the oil. But one of His disciples, Judas Iscariot, Simon's son, who would betray Him, said, "Why was this fragrant oil not sold for three hundred denarii and given to the poor?" This he said, not that he cared for the poor, but because he was a thief, and had the money box; and he used to take what was put in it. But Jesus said, "Let her alone; she has kept this for the day of My burial. For the poor you have with you always, but Me you do not have always." Now a great many of the Jews knew that He was there; and they came, not for Jesus' sake only, but that they might also see Lazarus, whom He had raised from the dead. But the chief priests plotted to put Lazarus to death also, because on account of him many of the Jews went away and believed in Jesus. The next day a great multitude that had come to the feast, when they heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem, took branches of palm trees and went out to meet Him, and cried out: "Hosanna! 'Blessed is He who comes in the name of the LORD!' The King of Israel!" Then Jesus, when He had found a young donkey, sat on it; as it is written: "Fear not, daughter of Zion; Behold, your King is coming, Sitting on a donkey's colt." His disciples did not understand these things at first; but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that these things were written about Him and that they had done these things to Him. Therefore the people, who were with Him when He called Lazarus out of his tomb and raised him from the dead, bore witness. For this reason the people also met Him, because they heard that He had done this sign.

Some Notes for Great and Holy Week and Pascha

- The Holy Mystery of Repentance can be received before or after any of the services throughout Great and Holy Week.
- All parishioners are encouraged to find some extra quiet time each day this week for prayer, reading of Scripture, and other spiritual reading. It will allow for a deeper experience of the Sacred Mysteries we will be celebrating. If you would like to come to Church to prayer, please, please, please call—we will gladly open for you!
- The Holy Mystery of Anointing of Oil will be celebrated on Great Wednesday is available for all. It is strongly recommended that this be in combination with the Holy Mystery of Repentance as both are sacraments of healing. Therefore, please go to Confession either before or immediately after the reception of this Mystery (if you haven't already). An examination of conscience is available at the back of the church to assist your preparation.
- According to the particular law of the Ukrainian Catholic Church, Great Friday is a day of strict fast. This means that no meat, meat products, dairy, dairy products, or alcohol may be consumed on this day, and we ought to eat less than on a normal day.
- Great Saturday is a day of rest. I know that many are preparing their Easter Baskets for blessing on Pascha. Please, if at all possible, avoid shopping on this day. Please plan ahead.
- If at all possible, please extend the fast of Great Friday through Great Saturday.
- For those who will participate in the Paschal Matins, near the end of the service, while we sing "Christ is Risen!" we exchange the Paschal Kiss. Please come forward (if you feel comfortable) to Father Michael for the greeting and then move to the side and greet other parishioners.
- For those who cannot participate in the Paschal Matins service, the Divine Liturgy will begin at approximately 9:15-9:30 am.
- Starting on the Feast of Pascha and lasting until the Vespers for Holy Spirit Monday (the day after Pentecost), in honour and in celebration of the Death and Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, we do not kneel for any prayers or services either in the church or at home.
